**Subject: Inquiry Report in the matter of Imanae Malik Daughter of Aqeel Ahmed Malik.**

Sir,

By office memorandum bearing No. ADM/3349/09/L dated 30<sup>th</sup> November 2009 we have been required to conduct an inquiry on the death of Imanae Malik in the hospital and to find out the negligence, if any, on the part of the hospital.

The brief facts as we gathered from the hospital record and from the interview/statements of the concerned duty doctors and paramedics staff are that the patient namely, Imanae Malik, aged 3 years presented to the emergency of this hospital at about 4:20am on 29-11-2009 with scald burn on her left hand. She was irritable with pain, Dr. Sabar Ali (CMO) attended to her and advised Xylocain Gel and Dermazine ointment to be applied locally which was done but the child was still in pain. Dr. Mobeen Ifzal Ch. the resident medical officer surgery was called who prescribed Syp. Brufen and Syp. Phenergan 1 x TSF (one tea spoon full) each. The child was still very irritable and her family was very concerned about her pain. Resultantly, pediatric consultation was sought and Dr. Sundip Kumar (MO Paeds), was called in the emergency who advised Inj. Dormicum 2.5mg, which was amended to 2.0mg after calculating the dose and administered intravenously. However, Imanae Malik was still in pain, which caused a grave concern to her family members. Dr. Sundip Kumar was again summoned to the emergency who keeping in view the anxiety of the family members of the child patient and in order to relieve the child patient from her irresistible pain advised Inj. Pavulon, which was accordingly as per the advice of Dr. Sundip Kumar the nurse in his presence injected the said injection intravenously. After a few minutes the patient went into respiratory arrest and a CODE BLUE was called. CPR was initiated, she was intubated and ventilated with an ambu bag. Availability of a pediatric ventilator was checked with other hospitals and she was shifted to Children Hospital. Our finding in the treatment of Imanae Malik is that she was properly looked after by the hospital and the medication was given to her properly with the exception of the Pavulon Inj. which was given by Dr. Sundip Kumar to Imanae Malik. As per Dr. Sundip Kumar who is presently working in Children Hospital that



said injection was given / advised by him as a sedative drug just to relax the patient from unbearable pain as well as to lessen the anxiety of her family members. We afraid that the concept of Dr. Sundip Kumar in respect of Pavulon Inj. is not correct and up to the mark. The action and suggestion of Dr. Sundip Kumar in the above-mentioned case is apparently an error and misconception on the part of Dr. Sundip Kumar in respect of the use/consumption of Pavulon Inj.


In view of the above facts and circumstances we humbly request you to kindly take serious action against Dr. Sundip Kumar on account of his negligence, mishandling of the patient mentioned above, treatment not up to the mark and lack of knowledge in respect of drugs/medicines.





MICU 29/11/09 (7:00 AM Writing Time)

I attended the pt at 6:00 AM in ER on a code blue announcement by operator.

I found that she was pulseless and was not breathing. CMO on duty was doing cardiac massage. I immediately joined CPR. After ambu bag ventilation  $\bar{e}$   $\uparrow$   $\text{NO}_2$  for 2 min I passed FTT  $\text{NO}_4$  and started ambu bag ventilation  $\bar{e}$   $\text{a}$  predictive ambu bag. Meanwhile my fellow doctors continued cardiac massage and all necessary medication including 1ij Atropine, 1ij Adrenaline, 1ij  $\text{NaHCO}_3$  and 1ij Dopamine  $\text{kt}$  and after 15-20 min pts heart was revived. I continued ambu bag ventilation for 45 min meanwhile no spontaneous breathing activity was seen so I advised mechanical ventilation and asked the CMO to arrange for it.
